MINISTER'S MESSAGE



A Model for Ministry

"You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." Acts 1:8

When Jesus left the earth, He left His Disciples with a challenge: spread the good news. In Matthew 28, Jesus said that the Apostles were to make disciples of all nations. In Mark 16, He told them to go into all the word. But in Acts 1, Jesus gave them a pattern.

First, He said go to Jerusalem. This was the city that lay at the center of Jewish society. It was the city where everything would begin for the Church. On the day of Pentecost, the Apostles would be in that city preparing to bring that good news. Jesus told them to start as witnesses there. Second, He said to go through Judea. This was the region in which Jerusalem was found. After spreading the news in that first city, they were to spread it into the surrounding countryside and cities. Proximity was important. Third, they were to go to Samaria. Samaria was the region immediately north of Judea. It was inhabited by people who were mixed race and not purely Jewish. They also did not worship as the Jews did. They were different. And Jesus expected this to be the next stop in the expansion of the Disciples ministry.

Finally, He told them to go throughout the world. And they did! Biblical and secular history shows that they spread the message across all of the known world.

Have we modeled our ministry in the same way? Where is our first priority of ministry? It should be at home. Next we should prioritize those around us and like us. Then those who are near but different. Finally, when we have ministered to all of the above, we can reach out to the wider world.
