MINISTER'S MESSAGE



I Will Not Keep Silent

The prophet Isaiah had a difficult job. His was to tell a nation of people that they were doomed. Babylon was coming for Judah. There was no way out. Judah had her chances before this but did not take advantage of them. Isaiah had a conviction about his role before God. He knew he had to tell the people to repent. He knew there was still hope for the Israelites even though there was no avoiding a long captivity. Isaiah wrote, *“For Zion’s sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem’s sake I will not be quiet, until her righteousness goes forth as brightness, and her salvation as a burning torch”* (Isaiah 62:1).

The world around us is a place of turmoil. There is war, political division, prejudice, hate, and everything else evil. It can be so discouraging. So, what can we do about it? We could have a resigned attitude. We could say, “I am a Christian and I am ok and the world can suffer the consequences of being wicked.” Or we could be like Isaiah. We could steel ourselves and say, “I will not keep silent!” If we love the people around us and the nation we live in we won’t be quiet and allow wickedness to continue. We will be the righteousness we want to see in this world. And then, if the Lord is willing, He will use us to make a wave come across our communities. People will see our faith and know God’s love. Our communities and our nation will come to Him.
